Spring 2017 Adams County Land & Water Conservation Tree & Shrub Sale Information



IMPORTANT INFO: This packet contains all the information you need to purchase your trees and shrubs, including descriptions and an order form. You **do not** need to be an Adams County landowner to order, nor do the trees need to be planted in Adams County. Please read this information carefully. Mail your order, along with payment, to the address on the order form by February 24, 2017. Credit-card payments available for MasterCard, Visa, Discover, and American Express; (add flat fee of \$4.00). Circle the card-company's identity, fill-in your last four digits, then phone-in, or separately reveal, the leading digits and expiration date of your account in order to use the credit-card option.

ORDER DEADLINE: Friday, February 24, 2017. As order deadline grows nearer, some species offered may face availability limitations, **so order EARLY** to be best-assured of quantities desired.

PICK-UP DATE & LOCATION: Friday, April 28, 2017 from 11:00 a.m. until 6:30 p.m. and Saturday, April 29, 2017 from 8:30 a.m. until 10:00 a.m. Pick-up site/location is at the Adams County Fairgrounds on Highway J, approximately ½ mile west of Hwy 13, in Friendship.

TREE PLANTING ASSISTANCE: The Adams County Land & Water Department has tree planters available for rent. Both are used with a three point hitch and are on a trailer with a 2 inch ball. Rental fee is \$20.00 per 1,000 trees. Rental dates are on a first come, first serve basis so reserve early. (This service is managed solely by the DNR Forestry Office at 608-339-3386.)

Evergreen Trees

Birch—White: Grows 50-75 ft. This is a strong tree that stands up to ice and snow, as well as salt. It is tolerant of many types of soil, even nutrient-poor soils, but grows best in moist, well-drained, loose soil.

Fir—Canaan: Height 30-70 ft. Canaan Fir is a genetic cross between Fraser and Balsam Fir. May be more tolerant of wetter soil and a variety of soil types. Makes an excellent Christmas tree and Landscape tree.

Fir—Balsam: The traditional Christmas tree. Mature height is 75 ft. Excellent fragrance with good needle retention. Prefers well-drained, acidic, moist soil with full to partial sun.

Fir—Fraser: Referred to as the Cadillac of Christmas trees. Excellent fragrance and exceptional needle retention. Likes cool, moist, well-drained soil with full to partial sun. Will not do well in heavy, wet clay soil.

Pine—Norway Red: Most versatile conifer for the area. Grows over 35 ft. Rapid growing tree with 4" to 6" long, glossy-green needles. Does well in sandy, dry soil.

Pine—White: Grows over 35 ft. Vigorous growing, tree with long, soft bluish-green needles. Tolerates shade and prefers sandy loam soil.

Spruce—Colorado Blue: Grows over 35 ft. Slow growing, densely formed tree with stiff, silvery-blue to bluish-green needles. Thrives in dry, well-drained soil.

Spruce—Norway: Grows over 35 ft. Fastest growing spruce with dark green needles and draping branches. Good ornamental or windbreak tree. Grows well in most conditions.

Spruce—White: Moderate growing tree with bluish-green needles and short, dense branches. A popular Christmas tree as well as an ornamental and windbreak tree. Endures drought conditions well.

Deciduous Trees and Shrubs

Maple—Sugar: Slow to medium growth. Height 100 ft. Outstanding native shade tree. Dark green leaves turn yellow to orange to fiery red in fall. Grows in most soil types. Sap used for maple syrup. Used for ornamental, lumber, & Wildlife habitat.

Maple—Silver: Very hardy, easy to grow tree, and will tolerate a wide variety of soils. One of the best trees to grow where few others will survive. Grows to 60ft.

Maple—Red: Mature height 50-60 ft. Shade tree with glossy green leaves. Tolerates wet soils. Fall colors vary from yellow to scarlet.

Hazelnut: Small shrub often in clumps reaching 12 ft. in height. Edible brown nuts. Grows best in moist soil, well drained soils but will adapt to most types of soils. Full sun or deep shade. Attracts wildlife.

Poplar—Hybrid: Fast growing tree. Grows 50 ft. and spreads 30 ft. Large leaves give it lots of shade in a hurry. Soil adaptable.

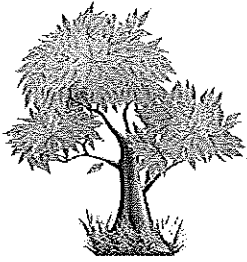
Crabapple—Midwest: An excellent tree for windbreak, wildlife habitat, and recreational plantings. This tree is extremely winter hardy and disease resistant, and can reach 20 ft. in 16 years.

Cranberry—American Highbush: Attractive foliage turns red and orange in the fall. Flat clusters of white flowers are followed by red berries. Grows to 8 feet.

Dogwood—Red Osier: Grows 7 to 9 feet and spreads 8 to 12 ft. A broad and erect grower with dark blood-red branches. White flowers are followed by white berries. Good for soil erosion and food and cover for wildlife.

Elderberry: Grows 9 ft. or taller and spreads 5 to 12 ft. This is a fast growing small tree/shrub that tolerates a wide range of growing conditions. Small white flowers grow in large clusters in early summer, followed by edible purplish black fruit. Attractive to birds.

Lilac—Common: Grows 12 to 15 ft. and spreads 10 to 12 ft. Delicate fragrant purple flowers in May. A perfect informal hedge or screen. Grows in almost any well-drained soil and full sun.

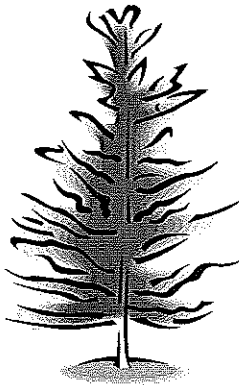
